# **Amplitude Scarf**

Ride the crest and fall of an elongated wave stitch as you work vertical stripes on this fun and easy scarf which is finished off with a thick fringe. Choose your favorite color combination, or be inspired by the colors of a school, team, or Hogwarts house. This is a great intro for newer crocheters wanting to learn to read patterns and stitch diagrams.

## **GAUGE**

4" = 14.5 sts and 13.5 rows in Long Wave Stitch, blocked Note: yarns shown usually knit at 21-23 sts to 4" in Stocking Stitch

# **FINISHED DIMENSIONS**

Width: 6.5" Length: 56" not including fringe

#### **MATERIALS**

230 yards DK weight yarn in main color
190 yards DK weight yarn in contrast color
US I (5.5mm) crochet hook **or size needed to obtain gauge**yarn needle

#### **DEFINITIONS**

**CC:** contrast color

**ch:** chain

hdc: half-double crochetdc: double crochetMC: main colorsc: single crochet

**sk:** skip

st(s): stitch(es)
tr: treble crochet

#### **LONG WAVE STITCH**

(worked flat on a foundation chain with a multiple of 14 ch plus 2)

Note: Change color by working the final st of the row until 2 loops remain, then yarn-over with new color and draw through both loops on hook to finish and be ready to work with new color. Carry the unused color loosely along the edge of the piece. The carried-along strands will be hidden when you add the fringe.

Set-up Row: with MC and working in back loops of foundation chain, sk 2ch, \*1sc in next ch, 1hdc in each of next 2ch, 1dc in each of next 2ch, 1tr in each of next 3ch, 1dc in each of next 2ch, 1hdc in each of next 2ch, 1sc in each of next 2ch, repeat from \* to end of row, turn.

Row 1: with MC, ch1 (counts as 1sc), sk 1<sup>st</sup> st, 1sc in next st and each st to end of row, working final sc in top of turning chain and changing color in last st, turn.

Row 2: with CC, ch4 (counts as 1tr), sk 1<sup>st</sup> st, \*1tr in next st, 1dc in each of next 2 sts, 1hdc in each of next 2 sts, 1sc in each of next 3 sts, 1hdc in each of next 2 sts, 1dc in each of next 2 sts, 1tr in each of next 2 sts, repeat from \* to end of row, working final tr in turning chain, turn.


Row 3: with CC, as row 1.

Row 4: with MC, ch1 (counts as 1sc), sk 1<sup>st</sup> st, \*1sc in next st, 1hdc in each of next 2 sts, 1dc in each of next 2 sts, 1tr in each of next 3 sts, 1dc in each of next 2 sts, 1hdc in each of next 2 sts, 1sc in each of next 2 sts, repeat from \* to end, working final sc in turning chain, turn.



## **SCARF**

- 1. With MC, loosely chain 198 sts. Work in Long Wave Stitch for 6.5" ending with Row 1. Tie off.
- 2. Weave in all yarn ends.
- 3. Add fringe to the end of each stripe by cutting 8 pieces of yarn 15" long, folding in half and using crochet hook to pull center of fringe through edge at center of stripe to form a loop, then pulling loose ends through loop and tightening fringe.
- 4. Block scarf by steaming it, or by gently washing and laying it flat to dry.
- 5. Trim fringe evenly.

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
