Chromata

Kirsten Hipsky

Finished measurements

Cowl: 40" [100 cm] long, 8" [20 cm] wide, pictured on last page

Scarf: 60" [150 cm] long, 8" [20 cm] wide, without fringe

Yarn

Lark by Quince & Co

(100% American wool; 134yd [123m]/50g)

Cow

• 4 skeins color Sabine 150

Approx 530 yd [485 m]

Scarf

1 skein each color: Sabine 150 (Color A), Kittywake
151 (Color B), Kumlien's Gull 152 (Color C), Iceland
153 (Color D), Egret 101 (Color E)

Approx 130 yd [120 m] of each color

Needles

• One 40" [100 cm] circular needle (circ) size US 9 [5.5 mm]

Or size to obtain desired gauge

Gauge

16 sts and 32 rows = 4" [10 cm] in garter stitch, after blocking (exact gauge not crucial).

- Cowl is knitted flat in garter stitch and then seamed to form a continuous loop.
- 2. Scarf is knitted flat, then the first and last 8 stitches are dropped and unraveled all the way down through the cast on edge and knotted to form fringe.
- 3. Instructions are included for knitting both projects at a specific gauge (stitches per inch) with Lark, or for any other gauge desired.

- 4. Note that using a different gauge will affect the yardage requirements to reach the same dimensions as the models. More stitches per inch will require more yardage. Fewer stitches per inch will require less.
- 5. I recommend casting on with a long-tail cast on using a separate strand of the same color (or the outer end of a center-pull ball) as the "tail" to avoid running out of tail yarn.

Cowl

Using the long-tail cast on, CO 160 sts. Do not join.

Row 1: Knit.

Cont in garter stitch (knit every row) until piece measures 8" [20 cm] from cast-on edge or desired width/height of cowl.

Bind off all stitches loosely and fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (approx 1 yd [1 m]).

Proceed to Finishing.

For any gauge

Make a large swatch (4" to 6" [10 to 15 cm] square) in garter stitch with desired yarn(s) and needles. Adjust needle size to achieve desired fabric density. Wet-block swatch by soaking in warm water with mild soap (we suggest Twig & Horn Wool Soap). Rinse in the same temperature water if necessary, using no agitation. Roll the swatch up in a towel to squeeze out excess water. Let your swatch lay flat to dry.

When the swatch is dry, count the number of stitches in 4" [10 cm], avoiding the edges of the swatch if possible. Make a note of this number.

Using the long-tail cast on, cast on 40" [100 cm] worth of stitches (to find this, multiply your 4" [10 cm] stitch count by 10). Do not join.

Work in garter stitch (knit every row) until piece meas 8" [20 cm] from cast-on edge or desired width/height of cowl.

Bind off all stitches loosely and fasten off, leaving a long tail for seaming (approx 1 yd [1 m]).

Finishing

Seam cowl along side edges using mattress stitch. Sew in all loose ends and steam- or wet-block.

Scarf

Using the long-tail cast on and Color A, cast on 240 sts. Do not join. Cut color A.

Row 1: With Color B, knit across. Cut Color B.

Row 2: With Color C, knit across. Cut Color C.

Row 3: With Color D, knit across. Cut Color D.

Row 4: With Color E, knit across. Cut Color E.

Row 5: With Color A, knit across. Cut Color A.

Rep Rows 1-5 until piece meas 8" [20 cm] from cast-on edge or desired width of scarf, ending with a Row 4 (color E).

Next row bind off row: Slip the first 8 sts to the RH needle, leaving approx 4" [10 cm tail], attach Color A and bind off loosely until 8 sts rem on LH needle. Cut Color A, leaving approx 4" [10 cm tail] and fasten off.

Create fringe

Drop the remaining 16 sts off the needles and unravel them all the way down through the cast-on edge. Tie fringe close to the knitted edge with overhand knots in groups of 4 or 5 ends. Trim ends to make them even. Proceed to Finishing.

For any gauge

Swatch as for the cowl to find your stitch count over 4" [10 cm].

With Color A and using the long-tail cast on, cast on 60" [150 cm] worth of stitches (to find this, multiply your 4" [10 cm] stitch count by 15). Do not join.

Work as for scarf, above, until piece meas 8" [20 cm] from cast-on edge or desired width of scarf.

Next row bind off row: Slip the first 2" [5 cm] worth of stitches to the RH needle, leaving approx 4" [10 cm tail] attach bind off color and bind off loosely until 2" [5 cm] worth of stitches rem on LH needle. Cut bind off yarn, leaving approx 4" [10 cm tail] and fasten off.

Create fringe as for scarf, above.

Finishing

Steam- or wet-block scarf if desired.
